ABOUT DOD WARRIOR GAMES

The 2016 DoD Warrior Games is an adaptive sports competition for wounded, ill and injured service members and veterans.

Approximately 250 athletes will participate in eight sporting events, representing teams from the Army, Marine Corps, Navy/Coast Guard, Air Force, U.S. Special Operations Command and the United Kingdom (U.K.) Armed Forces.

The DoD Warrior Games highlight the resiliency and warrior spirit of service members, veterans and their families and caregivers. Adaptive sports and athletic reconditioning activities play a fundamental role in the successful recovery and reintegration of our service members and veterans.

From the set up at the venues, to the equipment, to the officials at each event, the DoD Warrior Games is operating in accordance with International Paralympic standards.

WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL

SCHEDULE – The Wheelchair Basketball competition will be held at the Arvin Gym on Saturday, 18 June, from 2pm – 9pm for Bracket Play, followed by the Bronze Medal Match. The Gold Medal Match will be played on Tuesday, 21 June at 3pm.

COMPETITION – The tournament will consist of six, ten-player teams. A 24-point team limit is in place, meaning at no time (in a game) shall a team have players on the court and participating whose total assigned point value exceeds the 24-point limit.

CLASSIFICATION – Players will be assigned a point (classification) from one (1) to six (6) based on their function in relation to wheelchair. Players in each point group have different volumes of action, and this is what determines the final point value. All women drop 1 point in combined play.

PERFORMANCE – In the 2015 DoD Warrior Games, the Marine Corps won the Gold Medal, Navy the Silver Medal, and Air Force the Bronze Medal.

FACTS – In Wheelchair Basketball, the chair is considered to be part of the body. For example: a player is out-of-bounds when any part of his/her body or wheelchair touches the floor or any object on or outside of a boundary line.

To execute a dribble, players must allow for one bounce of the ball for every two (2) pushes of their chair.

Wheelchair basketball athletes are required to have a calf-strap on their chair in order to stop players from using their feet to control their chair. Wheelchairs can also have anti-tip casters, which are used to prevent the wheelchair from tipping over backwards.


